What's a Syllabus?

The Syllabus is YOUR friend

If you're ever confused about what is going on in class, you can always refer to the syllabus. Here is how the syllabus can be helpful during the school year:

- Able to plan the semester ahead since most dates are on it
- Able to keep track of attendance by being aware with the classes attendance policy
- Has the teachers contact information like email or phone number. It can also include the teachers Office Hour Schedule if you ever need help with the material

At the end of the day, you can be less stressed because you go to get a good understanding of how to do the work!

Don't fear, professors usually leave a digital copy on Blackboard. If not ask a classmate, they'll be happy to help!



Don't forget this!

- Do a weekly review of the syllabus to keep on top of classes
- Ask questions! It is okay to ask questions if assignments on the syllabus are not clear
- Write down the dates on your calendar, whether it's on your desk or on your phone
- If reviewed in class highlight the important parts of the syllabus and take notes on it
